We'll start by highlighting federal funding sources available right now and how to integrate federal funding into local financing streams. Utilizing Clean Energy Finance Programs in Your Community

Streamlining Federal Transportation Partnership

For five years, Congress' Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) programs grew federal transportation investments with local governments. Thousands of communities have applied and won transportation funding for essential infrastructure projects, but these IIJA programs expire next year, and the federal processes have been slow to adapt. Now a new Congress and President Trump's U.S. Department of Transportation are setting a new infrastructure agenda focused on streamlining so local governments must be ready to share what is working and what is broken in the infrastructure delivery system as Congress and the administration debate the next federal infrastructure package.

Building Tech-Ready Connected Communities

Is your community ready to take advantage of connected infrastructure, cutting-edge advances in technology like artificial intelligence and an increasingly digital economy?
